



Preparing for College - Paperwork

Applying to college requires a lot of paperwork, here are a few important processes that need to be completed to apply.

Sending Transcripts and Scores

- Official high school transcripts are required with college applications
- Each school has their own deadline for receiving transcripts, but it is a good idea to have them sent while you are working on your application
- Official transcripts should be submitted by your guidance counselor
 - Different high schools have different procedures, but you will likely have to submit an official transcript request or meet with your counselor to have transcripts sent
- Follow up with your counselor two weeks before the deadline to ensure transcripts have been sent
- College applications also require you to submit official transcripts from any colleges or universities at which you have dual enrolled
 - > This can often be done online, but each school is different
 - Contact the school that you have dual enrolled at for instructions on how to send official transcripts to other colleges

Sending SAT Score Reports

- You can select four colleges to receive your score for free either when you register or within nine days after taking your test
- After the nine day window has passed, you can send score reports for a fee of \$12 each
- Score report rush orders are available for \$31+
- Here's how to send SAT scores, step by step:
 - 1. Sign in to your College Board account and click on " Send Scores"
 - 2. Click on "Send Available Scores Now" if you want to send your scores right away, or click on "Send Scores When Available" if you're registered for an upcoming test
 - 3. Search for your colleges by state and name, and click "Add" to make them score report recipients
 - 4. Repeat this process for as many schools until your list is complete
 - 5. Double check your order and pay

6. You may check your account to see if the scores have been sent after your testing date

Completing the SSAR

- The SSAR or Self-reported Student Academic Record allows you to enter, track, and submit your academic record electronically to participating colleges and universities. It is required by many universities for admission.
- To complete it:
 - 1. Go to <u>https://ssar.selfreportedtranscript.com/login.aspx</u> and create an account.
 - 2. Input high school(s) and all you have classes taken, are currently taking, or are planning to take throughout high school and corresponding grades.
- Be accurate as they will be compared with your transcripts. Any mistake can result in grounds to rescind your admission.
