What is the Common App

- The Common App allows you to complete a universal college application that can be submitted to multiple different colleges at once
- It is used by over 800 colleges and universities across 20 countries
- Benefits of the Common App:
 - It connects you to more schools than any other college application system
 - It allows you to apply to multiple schools with just one application
 - It saves you time and energy that can then be used to make your application even better
 - Application deadlines are tracked and the system notifies you when they are approaching

When Should You Start the Common App

- Each year, the updated version of the Common App opens on August 1st
 - It is a good idea to begin the application as soon as it opens, before the start of senior year
 - This allows you to begin exploring colleges, drafting essays, and inputting information before classes and homework pick back up
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Step 1: Making an Account

- Create a login using an email and password
- Add general information to your profile
 - Personal information
 - Contact details
 - Family background and education
 - Test scores

Step 2: Add Colleges to Your Application List

- Use the “College Search” tab to search for institutions based on name, location, or deadline
 - Schools that you are interested in can be added to your “My Colleges” tab
 - This tab consolidates deadlines, requirements, and progress for each school in one convenient location
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Step 3: The Application

- You only submit one general application
 - It is comprised of your high school courses, grades, activities, exam scores and dates, parental information, etc.
- Each school may have their own additional requirements
- The Common App Requirements Grid details the requirements for all colleges in the system
 - It can be found on their website

Other Resources on the Common App Website

- “Virtual Counselor” tab
 - Gives students access to dozens of helpful videos about the general college application process and the process of filling out the Common App, courtesy of expert virtual counselors
 - Includes articles with helpful tips for choosing, applying for, and affording college
 - Provides a section for students to tweet the Virtual Counselors regarding any questions they may have about high school or college
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Other Resources on the Common App Website (Cont.)

- “Plan Ahead” tab
 - Composed of four subheadings: Why Go to College, How to Prepare, How to Pay for College, and How to Transfer
 - Why Go to College tab
 - Discusses the personal and financial benefits of college
 - How to Prepare tab
 - Provides a college prep guide detailing the main focuses of middle school, 9th grade, 10th grade, 11th grade, and 12th grade
 - How to Pay for College tab
 - Details tips and resources to start saving for college and ways to apply for scholarships and financial aid
 - How to Transfer tab
 - Explains the process of transferring colleges, understanding credit transfer, and utilizing financial assistance
