



SAT - Scholastic Assessment Test

The SAT is a standardized test that tests a student's Critical Reading, Math, and Writing abilities.

SAT Basics

- The test is broken into three sections, as well as an optional essay
- The total test runs 3 hours and 50 minutes with the essay
 - > Reading: 65 minutes for 52 multiple choice questions
 - > Writing: 35 minutes for 44 multiple choice questions
 - Math: 58 questions broken into a 55 minute section (calculator-optional) and a 25 minute section (no-calculator)
- The price of the test is \$52 without the essay and \$68 with the essay
- The SAT is scored out of 1600, while the essay is scored out of 24

SAT Prep

- Answer practice questions to familiarize yourself with the types of questions and content that you will see on the test
- Take full practice exams to help build your stamina and gauge your score
- Consider using a prep book
 - The Official SAT Study Guide, Cracking the SAT by Princeton Review, Barron's SAT Guide, and the SAT Prep Black Book are all good options

Registering for the SAT

- Create a College Board account <u>here</u>
- Register for the exam <u>here</u>
 - > While registering, upload a photo to verify your identity.
 - > Make sure you choose the right test (essay or no essay) in the right location
- Pay testing registration fee
 - ➤ Fee Assistance

- Students who qualify for free and reduced lunch can talk to their guidance counselor about obtaining a fee waiver
- When registering for your exam, enter the 12-digit code on the fee assistance card that you will receive if you qualify
- Print your admissions ticket to show at the testing center.

Accomodations

- Accommodations must be approved by the College Board's <u>Services for Students with</u> <u>Disabilities</u>
- Accommodations take approximately seven weeks to get approved, so start the process early!
- Work with your school to submit a request for accommodations
- After being approved, enter the SSD number found on your eligibility letter when registering for your exam

Checking Your Scores

- A few weeks after your exam you will receive an email that your score has been posted. <u>Here</u> you can log in to your College Board account and check your scores, additional data, and test distributions of that test day.
- You can also see what questions you got wrong if you paid for that service at registration (free if you have a fee waiver).

Understanding your SAT Score

- Score ranges:
 - ➤ Total score: 400-1600
 - ➤ Evidence-Based Reading and Writing: 200-800
 - ≻ Math: 200-800
 - Section Section Section Section Section 2-8 points for a total score of 6-24

- An average SAT composite score is around 1059, so anything above this is considered an above-average score

Sending Score Reports to Colleges

- You can select four colleges to receive your score for free either when you register or within nine days after taking your test
- After the nine day window has passed, you can send score reports for a fee of \$12 each
- Score report rush orders are available for \$31+
- Here's how to send SAT scores, step by step
 - 1. Sign in to your College Board account and click on " Send Scores"
 - 2. Click on "Send Available Scores Now" if you want to send your scores right away, or click on "Send Scores When Available" if you're registered for an upcoming test
 - 3. Search for your colleges by state and by name, and click "Add" to make them score report recipients
 - 4. Repeat this process for as many schools until your list is complete
 - 5. Double check your order and pay
 - 6. You may check your account to see if the scores have been sent after your testing date
